Lake Alexandrina Classic Re-emerges

I's back! The Lake Alexandrina Classic will be run on Saturday 13th February 2016 as the 6th race in the DSM Summer Series.

Many members will have fond memories of racing in the Lake Alexandrina Classic, the Goolwa to Milang Race, traditionally held in February each year.

As with the other two Classic races, the Milang-Goolwa Freshwater Classic and the Goolwa to Meningie Sailing Classic, the drought brought this race to a standstill.

An attempt was made by the Milang Regatta Club in 2014 to reinstate the race, but due to the small number of entries, it was cancelled.

Reluctant to see this Classic disappear, the Goolwa Regatta Yacht Club and the Milang Regatta Club have joined forces to bring this race back, under the umbrella of the DSM Landscape and Building Supplies Summer Series.

Marina Matters

Welcome to the first of what will be regular updates on the Goolwa Regatta Yacht Club's Carless Marina, brought to you by the Marina Committee - Louise Edwards, Steve West, Andrew Robertson, Nigel Barkham, Peter Gubbins, and new members Lloyd Goudge and Peter Gibberd.

Over the past 12-18 months, a range of maintenance activities have been undertaken including repairs to a number of boards on A Finger which have either been replaced or flipped. Whilst the boards were being repaired, underdeck repairs such as sealing the tops of posts were also undertaken. The attenuators on A and B Fingers have been replaced/repaired with an additional baton being installed and affixed to each individual attenuator board to prevent them from slipping out. Light/power/water pedestals have been refixed and lighting and water supply maintained. An underwater inspection of B Finger revealed the cross brace fixings to be in good condition. Numerous mooring lines have been replaced and adjusted.

On the item of mooring lines, the Marina Committee notes that a number of mooring lines are being replaced quite frequently and asks that boat owners be aware of lines running over sharp edges or at difficult angles and consider options for preserving lines such as a sheath.

Some members will have identified a silver metal box affixed to the marina just as you turn right onto B Finger. Inside this box is a bilge pump with extension cord for members to use in an emergency should your boat be sinking. Your Club Key will open this box.

The Marina Committee are seeking suggestions from Berth Licence Holders and Club Members on how to improve the marina. If you have an idea on how our marina and the surrounds could be improved, please let us know. You can either:

- fill in a maintenance request form and mark on it 'Improvement Idea';
- email the club (gryc@gryc.com.au) with the heading Attention Marina Committee;
- note your ideas down and drop them into the club; or
- speak to a member of the Marina Committee.

The Marina Committee convened a meeting of Berth Licence Holders on Sunday 15th November 2015. The draft minutes of this meeting can be found on the GRYC website in the Members Area. To log in, use GRYC1854 as both the logon and the password.

Finally, on behalf of the Marina Committee, we extend a big THANK YOU to the Tuesday Working Group for their ongoing commitment to maintenance on our marina.

Update on the GRYC Clubhouse Building Project

The total cost of the project is approximately \$275,000, depending on inclusions, final costings and negotiations. Currently, we have \$52,200 in the building fund, with a further \$6,500 pledged for payment in early 2016.

We are progressing slowly, primarily because we were unsuccessful with our bid for a SA Government community recreation and sports facilities grant. Currently, there seems to be no prospects for major grants from the Federal or State Governments for this type of project, so we are exploring all other avenues.

Our fundraising efforts aim to build without loan financing. We are extremely keen to progress the project, most likely in stages, utilising donations, fundraising, grants should they become available, sponsorship and voluntary contributions.

We will be looking for a significant contribution from marina berth-holders as marina fees in 2016 will be significantly cheaper than in previous years. A special request will be made seeking a donation to the building fund from berth-holders for the difference.

We will be actively applying for grants wherever appropriate. We have received \$3,000 from the Alexandrina Council Community

Donations Program and more local government grants are possible.

The plans developed for us by Keith Teagle for additions and improvements to the Clubhouse have received Development Plan approval. We have recently been granted a 12 month extension for our Development Plan Consent to 25th November 2016. This will allow us some flexibility with the build commencement during 2016.

Peter Nielsen is progressing with the documentation for building approval. This documentation will allow for staged development, so we can cost each stage, receive quotes and develop specific financing strategies for each stage.

The most likely staging would see the two undercover areas developed as stage one, with a temporary triangular shade for the central area. This would include paving, plastic roll up blinds and tables.

Stage two would then include the office, bridge and observation deck.

- purchase a defibrillator for the Club.

These options will be money well spent and will benefit the sailors and the volunteers.

The Corinthians Lodge have been very supportive and have recently initiated a perpetual trophy for our sailors who compete in races once a month. This will be presented as part of our Annual Dinner in 2016. They have also contributed \$1500 towards new sails for *As Good As It Gets* and the sails were officially raised at Opening Day by the Governor of South Australia, His Excellency the Honourable Hieu Van Le AO, who wished for fair winds for all who sail in her. This has been evident in recent results for this boat competing on Friday nights.

The Rotary Club has been generous as well in offering a contribution towards the recently purchased new motor for *Regatta 3* which provides much assistance to the sailors on the water.

To top it all off a local music group who is disbanding shared some of their dollars with our Sailability program as well.

So a very big THANK YOU to all who support the GRYC Sailability program.

New boats to GRYC

Kungari

A fter more than 20 years' absence, the Duncanson 26 GR211S has returned to GRYC. Her current name is '*Kungari*' the Ngarrindjeri word for swan. Kungari was built in 1980 and most likely was located in Goolwa from this time until the early 1990s. She was relocated to Narrung with her then new owners Charles and Johan Andre. She has been used extensively throughout the Lower Lakes and Coorong and has shown to be a very reliable vessel in a stiff breeze. Of recent times, Kate Andre and Joe Laforgia have taken ownership of Kungari and intend to commute from Narrung for the summer series. The photo is of *Kungari* nestled in her Nurra Nurra hideaway at the edge of the Narrows and Lake Albert.



Airboat Mariah

I purchased Airboat plans from the Clark Craft Company in NY USA in August 2007 and then set about building it. The frame timber was second hand Oregon which I stripped from several 6" by 6' beams. A 1600 VW motor drives a 1.5 metre beech propeller giving a top speed of 60 kph. The boat was completed and registered as *Mariah* in December 2008 and launched shortly after. Rick Eylward took the front seat (passenger) for the first trip and whilst trying to turn near the bridge with the boat travelling sideways at 25 degrees, I panicked and throttled off losing the effect of the air rudders. Being tail heavy Mariah spun and attempted to travel backwards and the transom dug in (broached) and a lot of water came in. After this episode I added wings at the stern to help keep out water, a bilge pump and a lot of flotation. With more experience I know not to throttle off except when travelling in a straight line. *Mariah* has featured in two Wooden Boat Festivals.

Lena

A 1926 vintage timber boat, *Lena* was bought by Alex and I in January 2015 from Noeline and Dave Hudson who brought her from Sydney to Goolwa in 2012. Measuring 20 feet stem to stern and weighing approximately 1.5 tonne she is a lovely little boat, with classic lines built from New Zealnd kauri planks on spotted gum ribs.

As a family of five keen 'sailors' we wanted a boat we could enjoy racing as well as social cruising in order to maximise all that Goolwa sailing has to offer. *Lena* was in need of some TLC, so we slipped her in March 2015 for the first stage of her 'makeover'. Alex and our son Joe sanded the hull back to timber, replacing the dark blue colour scheme with white, black and grey. The simple colour change brought out the beauty of her shape and I fell in love with her.


Wanting a boat we could sail as much as possible, we made the difficult decision to replace her gaff rig with a Marconi rig. Randal Cooper of Goolwa Masts and Welding did a fabulous job. Randal also made the bespoke Tabernacle from 'exotic' timber, as well as the mainsheet system, which is a work of art! The rigging and simple deck layout make her very easy and fun to sail.

Re-slipped in August 2015 for the second stage of the makeover, Alex and Joe with help from the *Lena* fan club, Andrew Seedsman (Captain Sturt Boat Supplies), Fraser Buchan and Randal Cooper reshaped and reinforced the cabin, extending the cockpit. *Lena* now has a spacious layout for such a little boat. The finished product is a beautiful boat with simple, classic lines and plenty of room to move.

Refurbishing a boat in Goolwa can be addictive. We really enjoyed the conversations and communal decision making that went with the process. Sailing brings together an eclectic mix of people and a catalyst for conversation and friendship, which lasts beyond the banks of the river and often way into the early hours.

We now have a versatile boat that ticks all the boxes and we have been sailing her in the GRYC Twilight Races as well as in the Goolwa Vintage Boat Club Races. We just need to find more time to fit in that social cruising.
