Course	Length	Overview	Areas Covered
Start Crewing	12 hours	The first step on the Keelboat pathway introduces you to the basics of sailing on a small boat, including boat handling, safety and sailing theory	Basic sailing terminology and rules, basic knots, tacking and gybing, main overboard recovery
Start Helming	12 hours	This course develops both your theory and practical skills to confidently take control of the helm	Preparation of the boat, helm and trim on all points of sail, recovery of man overboard whilst at the helm



# Learn to drive power boats at the GRYC

- Do you want to learn to drive a small powerboat?
- Would you like to man a safety boat to support your local sailing club?

This program will provide you with the necessary skills for the safe use of small powerboats, including the equipment to be carried, knowledge of seamanship, navigation and weather.

As part of the program you will have the opportunity to achieve the powerboat operator's certificate which satisfies licensing requirements in some states of Australia.

If you wish to assist in club events or desire to be an instructor, coach or official, then the Safety Boat Handling course is particularly beneficial. The skills and knowledge gained in this program can be applied in most of the other programs and it is highly recommended for all.

Course	Length	Overview	Areas Covered
Start Power Boating	12 hours	Your powerboating pathway begins here introducing practical driving skills, trip planning, boat maintenance and safety equipment. Following the course you will have sufficient skills and knowledge to skipper a small boat	Passage planning, equipment requirements, sourcing weather information, powerboat terminology and rules, boat launching and docking, basic steering and manoeuvre techniques, dealing with emergency situations
Powerboat Handling	8 hours	This course is designed to improve your boat handling skills, especially in confined areas such as marinas and in swell and waves	Pre-departure checks, engine and fuel checks, course navigation and passage planning, man overboard recovery, boat handling techniques in swells and waves, towing
Safety Boat Operator	12 hours	This course provides the skills needed to support water based activities at clubs, schools and outdoor recreation centres	Equipment selection, race management theory, race course design, communication techniques, rescue of other craft, lay and recover markers
